Punja Dhurries

The Punja dhurries of Rajasthan, UP and MP are traditionally produced in resplendent colours, adding a dash of energy to the room. These dhurries are made on a pit loom with a PUNJA, a claw-like device to pack the weft yarn, which makes the dhurrie long-lasting. The vibrant collection of dhurries is the perfect addition to any room. We introduce these dhurries in partnerships with Kalavilasa – Handmade in India who have been working with several weavers across many states.



Indian Folk Paintings

We launched our collection of Folk & Tribal Art from various parts of the country starting with the work of Suman Chitrakar (Bengal Pattachitra), Vidyanath Jha (Madhubani), Ramesh Tekam, Kaushalprasad Tekam (Gond), Pramodkumar Maharana (Palm Pattachitra), and many more.
