### **Our Recent Craft Workshops**

Ecoexist and Heart for Art Trust brought this September Ecofriendly Ganesh Idols workshops to Pune for making your own Ganesh idol with a master sculptor from the village of Pen- situated 80 kms away from Mumbai. Taught by: Shrikanth Deodhar. This was alsoabout the environmental impacts of the festival and learn about how you can celebrate it in a ecofriendly way. Comfortable size of participants - for amateurs, 15 to 20. Size of the idol - 10"-12".







In the end of August Heart for Art organised a special workshop in Pune to learn the art of making Ganapati Decorations with Sholapith. This workshop was an attempt to explore the indigenous craft of Sholapith from West

Bengal. Two master artisans - Rathindra Haldar and Rabindra Haldar from West Bengal demonstrated the exquisite work of Sholapith.

100% natural- Shola is a plant that grows in the marshy lands of West Bengal. Sholapith craft is used to create delicately carved flowers, headgear for Gods and decorative items which are 100% biodegradable. During the workshop the artisans taught how to make some ecofriendly flowers and other decorative. Participants learnt from them how to make makhar, their favourite modaks also. At the end of the workshop they got their own set of two lotus flowers, set of two modaks, set of two hangings (beautiful hand made decorations are made using hand made paper as well as flowers that are crafted out of shola pith) and one Chakra. All material required to make the above items were provided during the workshop. The sessions were fun, supportive and friendly, and the experience will live long in the memory of all participants.

We recently visited our Etikoppaka Woodcraft artisans in the Eastern Ghats area - 60 km from Vishakhapatnam. C V Raju has been working on preserving this craft, continuing family traditions over multiple generations. Great to see them work on new ideas - coming soon - Araku Coffee packaged in Etikopakka Wooden Barnis!



Etikoppaka, a village situated on the banks of the River Varaha, in the Visakhapatnam District of Andhra Pradesh, is home to more than 200 artisans who breathe life into wood. The name is synonymous with the beautiful wooden artefacts and lacquer colors and the primary attractions of the village are known to be lacquer toys and the sugar factory. It is said that the actual craft originated in the neighboring village

Nakkapalli, before it spread to its present home. The proximity of the forest area with plenty of Ankudu Karra and Poniki



Chekka, a light and soft wood, promoted the tradition of the woodcraft in the hamlet of Etikoppaka.
